Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Before 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

- **Complete enrolment:** If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. For more information, read about <u>Enrolling in School</u>.
- **Check your contact information:** Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us. You can check this information by contacting us directly.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice:

- in October, to verify your email address
- in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus.

Please check your junk mail regularly to make sure you do not miss an important email.

May also get weekend shifts



Welcome back to 2024/2025 Junior Basketball season!



VET ENGINEERING TRIP

On Monday the 2nd of September, the Year 11 and 12 VET Engineering students went to Mildura to visit some large manufacturing businesses for inspiration on an upcoming report. First on the list was TBAS who specialise in custom part manufacturing, utilising current CNC machines and CAM technology to make their parts.





Next up was Mildura Laser, they specialise in laser cutting and engraving sheet metal parts, as well as running their other business mass producing a range of grape vine trellises, they use current fibre optic laser technology and robotic welding to produce their products, with their most expensive machine costing over \$1 million dollars.

Last was A&G Engineering at Irymple who are Australia's leading beverage tank manufacturers, who supply many of the major companies in this space. Here the students saw a range of new manufactuirng technologies and learnt the process of how wine tanks are made. A big thank you to all of these businesses for their hospitality and time in taking the students for a tour of their impressive facilities.
