Fairy penguins have feathers that are dark blue, fading into white on the belly. Their flippers are blue. Fairy penguins are as tall as 35 cm, which is only a bit taller than a ruler! They have a sharp, black beak used to catch fish.



habitat and diet

Fairy penguins are found along the coastlines of southern Australia and New Zealand, but Phillip Island is home to the largest colony – with an impressive 40,000 breeding penguins! The Little Penguin will eat the equivalent of its body weight in food, every day! They feed on small fish, anchovies, pilchards, garfish and krill.

- Fairy penguins spend most of their time in the water.
- They can be very noisy!

Some fairy penguins are protected by sheepdogs! A breed of dog, was trained and placed on Middle Island to protect the penguins from foxes during the penguin breeding season.
